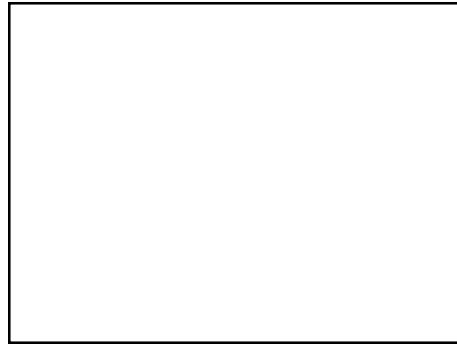


**8th North Carolina Four-Ball

When Chuck Tickle sank a nine-foot birdie putt on the first playoff hole against the defending champions, he and Mitch Adams became the first tandem to win two North Carolina Four-Ball titles. The 1997 champions (Adams and Tickle win this title only when the Florida Marlins win the World Series) birdied the 17th hole to draw even with Keith Harris and Dean Channell, the 2002 champions. Harris and Channell birdied the last four holes to take the lead. 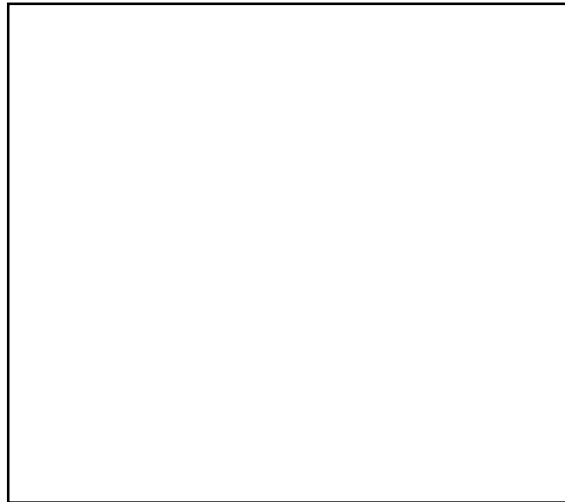
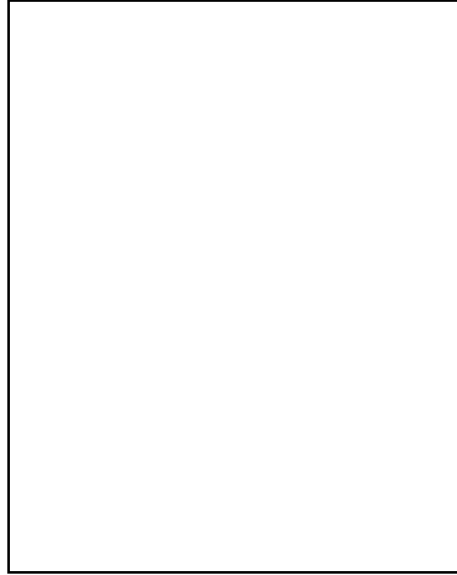
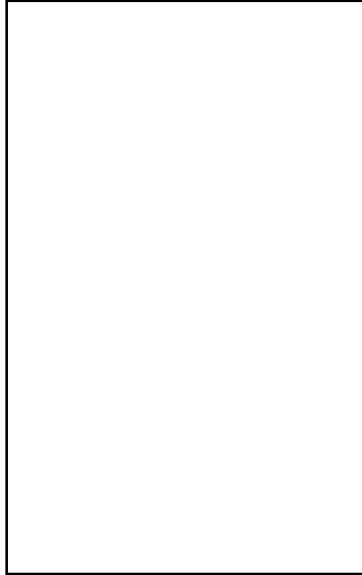
