## FORMAT

The championship is conducted at match play. There is an 18-hole stroke-play qualifying round to determine match play qualifiers and seedings. Defending champion Andy Knox will be seeded No. 1 for match play in the boys' division, while the top 63 boys from the stroke play qualifier will advance to match play. Because Neese is not returning in the girls' division, the top 32 from the stroke play qualifier will advance to match play.

## ELIGIBILITY

Entry is open to any male or female amateur golfer who has not reached his or her 19th birthday by the last day of the championship, has not started college, is a legal resident of North Carolina, and the junior golfer, parent or guardian is a member in good standing of a club which is a member of the Carolinas Golf Association (CGA). Tuesday, June 22, 18-hole qualifying round for match play (all players).

Wednesday, June 23, Boys: First and second round matches; Girls: First and second round matches in afternoon.

Thursday, June 24, Boys: Third round and quarterfinal matches; Girls: quarterfinal and semifinal matches.

Friday, June 25, Boys: Semifinal and Championship matches; Girls: Championship match.

## PRIZES

Trophies are awarded to the champion, runner-up, semifinalists and medalist in the boys division; to the champion, runner-up, semifinalists and medalist in the girls division. The Harry L. Welch Trophy is held for the ensuing year by the boys' champion. The Linda Marsh Trophy is held for the ensuing year by the girls' champion. The champion of the boys' division qualifies to represent the CGA in the Carolinas-Virginias Junior Boys Team Matches, Aug. 14-15 at the CC of Landfall in Wilmington, NC. The girls' champion qualifies to represent the CGA in the Mid-Atlantic Challenge, July 31-Aug. 1 at Independence GC in Midlothian, VA.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course, which is located just 15 minutes from greater Greensboro, was built on large rolling hills and many of its greens are elevated. There are many grass bunkers and sand bunkers throughout the

course. Additionally, there are water hazards that come into play on many holes. The course received a redesign from Davis Love III in 2003 to spruce up the original Maples design. Love repositioned the back tees, forcing doglegs and other obstacles to make up for the increased length off the tees for pros, while keeping the course fair for higher handicap players.

DIRECTIONS: From Greensboro, North Carolina – Take Interstates 40 & 85 to Exit 126. Turn onto Route 421 South and travel approximately seven miles to the stop light at Hagan Stone Park Road. Turn left on Hagan Stone Park Road and go about a quarter mile to the stop sign at Liberty Road. Turn left on Liberty Road, and take an immediate right at the entrance to Forest Oak Drive. Proceed approximately one mile. The Forest Oaks 27,000 sq. ft. clubhouse will be on the left.
